

The State of Play in SA



Male Registered Teachers in SA:

- Decreased by nearly 3% since 2007
- Decreases mainly from retirement

• 22 male preschool teachers employed across SA (2.40%)



The State of Play at UniSA




Male ECE pre-service teachers @ University of SA:


- Increased by 2% since 2011
- Increases mainly due to International students in MMET
- Less than half of MBET students come directly from high school





The State of Play at UniSA ctd.





Who are the male ECEs studying @ University of SA:

- Significant increase in men studying Master of Teaching (ECE)
- In 2015: 7 out of 8 students were international
- In 2016: 7 out of 9 students are international
- Less than half of male students enter UniSA via SACE pathways (high school graduates)



The Barriers we Face

'Whitehead (1996) concluded boys were avoiding [advanced study] courses they perceived as feminine at much higher rates than girls were avoiding courses they perceived as masculine' (Moritz Rudasill & Callahan 2010, p. 304).



- High profile cases of men in caring roles perpetrating child abuse (Families SA)
- Long-held gender roles and stereotypes held by societies, communities, families, parents, children
- Change is slow unless funding and support from government is provided


